Growth in total arrivals compared to 2021

Tourist arrivals

In 2022 the entry of 267,688 tourists¹ to the Galapagos was recorded. Of these, 54% correspond to foreigners (145,000 tourists), compared to 46% of national tourist arrivals (122,000 tourists).

Regarding the gateway to Galapagos, 72% of visitors arrived through the airport on Baltra Island and 28% through San Cristobal airport.

In relation to foreign tourist arrivals, the growth in 2022 compared to 2021 is +168% (+91 thousand tourists) and for nationals it is +49% (+40 thousand tourists).

The last 10 years


Between 2013 and 2022, the compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of tourist arrivals to Galapagos was 3.0%. The rate for foreign arrivals was 1.07% while for domestic arrivals it was 6.01%.



TOURIST ARRIVALS TO GALAPAGOS Variation (%) 2022 vs 2019

Tourist arrivals to the islands in 2022 decreased by 1% compared to 2019 (- 3,550 tourists), the year before the COVID-19 pandemic.

In relation to foreign arrivals, the reduction of the market compared to 2019 was 20% (-37,056 tourists). 03

For domestic arrivals it represented an increase of 38% (+33,506 tourists).

Year-on-year growth

Compared to tourist arrivals in 2021, 2022 reports a growth of +96% (+131 thousand tourists).

The months with the greatest growth in arrivals to Galapagos were March, April, July, August and December.


In 2022, the month of April recorded an increase of 7%, August 9% and October 10% over the same period in 2019. From the second half of the year onwards there was a greater increase in tourist arrivals compared to pre-pandemic levels.

Galapagos tourism recovers

By the end of 2022, international tourism reached 80% of pre-pandemic levels. According to Zurab Pololikashvili, UNWTO Secretary-General: "Tourism continues to recover steadily, despite various challenges of both geopolitical and economic nature..."

In 2022, more than 145 thousand foreign tourists travelled to the Galapagos Islands, this figure was more than double that of 2021 (+54 thousand tourists) but still 20% less than in 2019.

UNWTO foresees a good year for the sector, even if facing several challenges, such as the economic situation and continued geopolitical uncertainty (UNWTO, 2022).

Tourists are expected to increasingly seek more value for money and closer travel in response to the adverse economic context (UNWTO, 2022).

While international tourism is stabilising, domestic tourism is reaching and surpassing pre-pandemic levels, favouring the recovery of the tourism sector in the islands. The economic conditions have undoubtedly influenced tourists to choose travel options closer to home, with lower spending and shorter stays.

Year-round domestic tourist arrivals are above pre-pandemic levels. Monthly arrivals were 26% above 2019 levels in January 2022 and had reached 52% by December.

Emitting markets

75% of the market share of tourist arrivals to Galapagos is in two countries: Ecuador and the United States. In terms of foreign markets alone, the United States accounts for 52% of tourist arrivals, followed by the United Kingdom and Germany with 6%, Canada 5% and France with 3%.

Between 2021 and 2022, significant increases were recorded in the main source markets. Some countries that decreased their market share include France, Spain, Switzerland, Poland, Mexico, Colombia and Russia, while Canada, Israel, the United Kingdom and the Netherlands increased.

Seasonality of arrivals

March, April, July, July, August and December are the months with the greatest influx of tourists to Galapagos. January, February, September and October were the months with the lowest tourist arrivals.

Seasonality of tourist arrivals



The seasonality of travel varies depending on the issuing countries. In the case of northern hemisphere issuing countries such as the United States, their trips to Galapagos are concentrated in June, July and December, while Canada recorded a greater influx in the months of March, April, October and November.

In Europe, France, Spain, the Netherlands and Switzerland concentrate their trips in the middle of the year, Germany, the United Kingdom and the Netherlands in the months of October and November.

Seasonality of tourist arrivals TOP 10 issuing countries to Galapagos






Age of tourists to Galapagos

The average age of tourists to Galapagos is 41 years. The country with the youngest visitors is Ecuador (average age 36). Foreigners exceed the average age of nationals by 9 years (45 years on average). The average age of male and female tourists is 41 years.





Age range of tourists by origin

In age ranges, foreign visitors have a higher concentration of tourists aged over 41 years, while nationals are younger than 41 years.


It is important to note that a visitor can go to several sites during their stay in Galapagos.

Nearby visitor sites: Santa Cruz

In 2022 around 439,000 visits were recorded at the sites near the population centres of Santa Cruz island.

The site with the most visits was Tortuga Bay, with more than 153 thousand visitors, most of whom (48%) were nationals, followed by the Turtle Route-Fausto Llerena Breeding Centre with around 130 thousand visitors, most of whom were foreigners (54%).



Visitor sites near Isabela

In 2022, more than 107,000 visits were registered at sites near the island's population centres Isabela.

The site with the most visits was the Arnaldo Tupiza Breeding Centre, with more than 33,000 visitors, the majority of whom (75%) were foreigners, followed by Circuito Muro with more than 29 thousand visitors, the majority of whom were also foreigners (64%).




Visits on board private non-comercial vessels.

In 2022, there were 251 visitors on board private noncommercial boats that visited the tourist sites of the protected areas of Galapagos.

Comparing these visits with those of 2021 there was a reduction of 31 in the number of visitors and 42 in relation to 2019.
